And we weren't certain that she would be a good candidate for surgery.

Just look at Kaylee now! We are delighted to report that she has gained significant weight, her diabetes is now stabilized, and she has undergone successful eye surgery! Today Kaylee is a happy, bouncy bundle of energy. Now

she can see her squeaky toys and the ball she loves so much. She will keep returning

the ball it as long as you'll continue to throw it. And when you stop throwing it, she will drop it at the feet of one of the dogs and look at them hopefully. She asks for attention and affection, and is thoroughly engaged in life and bursting with joy! What a transformation, and we couldn't be happier.

Darbee At only eight years old, sweet Darbee has such severe arthritis in her knees and hips that she can barely walk. Her obesity has exacerbated the problem. Her roomies are two other Homeward Bound alums. They go for walks every morning and evening, and Emily charms all who meet her. Her foster home is furnished with comfy dog beds, fresh water fountains, lots of treat balls, chewy treats...and a foster mom and dad who spoil her thoroughly. Life is good for
